What: A free teacher workshop for K-12 teachers from the region. Learn about the extensive, unique research on the wolf-moose, predator-prey relationships that have been studied on Isle Royale for the last 50 years.

Isle Royale is the second-largest island in the Great Lakes, and its remote setting and ecology have provided an opportunity for internationally famous research.

The workshop will provide teachers with: a deeper understanding of wolf-moose and predator-prey relationships, access to curriculum materials that will help students understand these relationships, an opportunity to explore exhibit materials illustrating this research, and an opportunity to meet and discuss the research with the key scientists currently working on this project.
